 - Appropriate use of an AED, including placement of pads for adults and children aged older than 8 years
 - Specific considerations when using an AED on children aged between 1 and 8 years

 - Manage an unconscious breathing casualty
 - Followed the prompts of an automated external defibrillator (AED)
