

CPCWHS1001 PREPARE TO WORK SAFELY IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY



Course Overview

This unit of competency specifies the mandatory work health and safety training required prior to undertaking construction work. The unit requires the person to demonstrate person awareness and knowledge of health and safety legislative requirements in order to work safely and prevent injury or harm to self and others. It covers identifying and orally reporting common construction hazards, understanding basic risk control measures, and identifying procedures for responding to potential incidents and emergencies. It also covers correctly selecting and fitting common personal protective equipment (PPE) used for construction work.

Course Topics

- Queensland WHS legislation, regulations, standards, codes of practice and industry standards/guidance notes relevant to own work, role and responsibilities
- Duty of care, basic roles, rights and responsibilities of business owners and workers in relation to working safely while working in the construction industry
- Common construction hazards such as asbestos, confined spaces, electrical, excavations and trenches, dust, falling objects, dangerous goods, manual handling working at heights and more
- General construction emergency response, first aid response and evacuation procedures
- General construction work activities that require licenses, tickets or certificates of competency
- General procedures for reporting WHS hazards, accidents, incidents, emergencies, injuries, near misses and dangerous occurrences
- General workers' compensation and injury management requirements
- PPE used on a construction site and other safety gear including harnesses, sunscreen, safety footwear respiratory protection and more
- Meanings and symbols used on constructions sites such as safety signs, symbols and tags including emergency signs, fire signs, hazard signs and symbols, regulatory signs and symbols, safety and lockout tags, danger and out-of-service tags
